

Now that the fairways are dormant, please try not to drive all over them. Use the rough and the 90 degree rule. Please move your ball out of bare spots, no penalty. Please keep carts at least 30 ft. from any green. Please use the sand available on the carts and at the tee boxes to fill divots. Otherwise, you know the drill: sand divots in the fairways, repair ball marks on the greens and leave rakes <u>IN</u> the sand traps. Thank you.
