- Pool is closed for season. Moving furniture and getting ready for the winter months.

- Discussion as to who needed to contact Edward Jones for the new tax addition. It was stated to reach out one more time then letter will be sent.

- Discussed the Highway construction, specifically the culvert by the #1 Green. Mike Aldridge has been in contact with the State and has a meeting scheduled to discuss water runoff concerns.
- Discussed contacting Dever to look into the possibility of getting new carts sooner than next year when our current contract ends.
- Motion made by Gary Philpott and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Gary Varner to adjourn. Motion carried.
